A giant advent calendar has Christmas traditions from all over the world hidden behind each door. There may not be snow, but the students are excited for special lessons with their ALT.

The first years and special education classes made Christmas cards with English messages for teachers and classmates. First and second year classes learned about some of Christmas' history and about how Christmas is celebrated in the ALT's home country.
